











<b>Air Breathers (6)</b>		
<b>Arapaima</b>		The arapaima, pirarucu, or paiche is any large species of bonytongue in the genus Arapaima native to the Amazon and Essequibo basins of South America.
<b>Giant Featherback</b>		Chitala lopus, also known as the belida or giant featherback, is a species of freshwater fish, endemic to the islands of Java and Sumatra in Indonesia.
<b>Clown Featherback</b>		The clown featherback, also known as the clown knifefish and spotted knifefish, is a nocturnal species of tropical fish with a long, knife-like body.
<b>Black Alligator Gar</b>		The Black Alligator Gar is a formidable and prehistoric-looking freshwater fish, notable for its long, torpedo-shaped body, armored scales, and elongated snout filled with sharp, needle-like teeth.
<b>Silver Alligator Gar</b>		The Silver Alligator Gar is a striking variant of the alligator gar species, known for its gleaming, silvery scales that shimmer under light.
<b>Gourami</b>		Gouramis are a diverse group of freshwater fish native to Asia, popular in both natural habitats and home aquariums for their vibrant colors and fascinating behaviors.

<b>Giant Mekong Cat</b>		The Giant Mekong Catfish (Pangasianodon gigas) is one of the largest freshwater fish in the world, native to the Mekong River basin in Southeast Asia. Known for its massive size, it can grow up to 10 feet in length and weigh over 600 pounds.
<b>Amazon Redtail Cat</b>		The Amazon Redtail Catfish (Phractocephalus hemiliopterus) is a striking and powerful freshwater species native to the Amazon River basin and other South American waterways.






















<b>Asian Redtail Cat</b>		The Asian Redtail Catfish ( <i>Hemibagrus wyckioides</i> ) is a robust and striking freshwater species native to rivers and streams across Southeast Asia. This predatory fish is characterized by its dark, elongated body and a vivid red or orange tail fin, which makes it highly distinctive and visually appealing.
<b>Ripsaw Cat</b>		The Ripsaw Catfish ( <i>Oxydoras niger</i> ), also known as the Niger Catfish or Thorny Catfish, is a fascinating freshwater species native to the rivers of South America, including the Amazon and Orinoco basins.
<b>Black Wallago Cat</b>		The Black Wallago Catfish ( <i>Wallago attu</i> ), sometimes referred to as the Freshwater Shark, is a predatory fish native to rivers, lakes, and reservoirs across South and Southeast Asia.
<b>Silver Wallago Cat</b>		The Silver Wallago Catfish ( <i>Wallago leeri</i> ) is a striking freshwater species found in rivers, lakes, and reservoirs across South and Southeast Asia.
<b>Leopard Cat</b>		The Leopard Catfish ( <i>Corydoras trilineatus</i> ), also known as the Three-Stripe Cory or False Julii Cory, is a small and peaceful freshwater fish native to the rivers and streams of South America.
<b>Tiger Cat</b>		The Tiger Catfish ( <i>Pseudoplatystoma tigrinum</i> ), also known as the Tiger Shovelnose Catfish, is a striking freshwater species native to the rivers of South America, particularly the Amazon and Orinoco basins.

<b>Koi Carp</b>		The Koi Carp ( <i>Cyprinus carpio</i> ) is a vibrant, ornamental variety of the common carp that has been selectively bred for its stunning color patterns and beauty.

<b>Pacu</b>		The Pacu ( <i>Piaractus brachipomus</i> and <i>Colossoma macropomum</i> ) is a large, herbivorous freshwater fish native to the rivers of South America, particularly the Amazon and Orinoco basins.
<b>Tambaqui</b>		The Tambaqui ( <i>Colossoma macropomum</i> ) is a large, herbivorous freshwater fish native to the Amazon River basin in South America. Known for its robust body and striking appearance.






<b>Freshwater Stingray</b>		The Freshwater Stingray (Potamotrygonidae) is a family of rays found in the rivers and freshwater environments of South America, particularly in the Amazon and Orinoco basins.
<b>Silver Arowana</b>		The Silver Arowana (Osteoglossum bicirrhosum) is known for its long, metallic silver body and large, elongated fins, the Silver Arowana is often referred to as the "dragon fish" due to its appearance, which resembles that of mythical dragons in various cultures.
<b>Tarpon</b>		The Tarpon (Megalops atlanticus) is a large, powerful fish found in both saltwater and freshwater environments along the Atlantic coasts of the Americas, particularly in areas like the Gulf of Mexico, the Caribbean Sea, and parts of South America.
<b>Snakehead</b>		The Snakehead (Channa species) is a group of predatory freshwater fish native to parts of Asia and Africa. Known for their long, cylindrical bodies, large mouths, and sharp teeth, Snakeheads are highly adaptable and can thrive in a variety of aquatic environments, including rivers, lakes, and marshes.
<b>Tilapia</b>		Tilapia is a group of freshwater fish species that belong to the family Cichlidae. Native to Africa and the Middle East, Tilapia has become one of the most widely farmed fish species in the world, particularly in aquaculture due to its fast growth, adaptability to various environments, and relatively mild flavor.
<b>Sucker Fish</b>		Sucker Fish is a common name for several species of fish known for their unique, disc-shaped, sucker-like mouths that allow them to attach to surfaces such as rocks, the sides of other fish, and even boats.
<b>Apollo Shark</b>		The Apollo Shark (Labeo cyclorhynchus) is a freshwater fish species known for its striking appearance and unique behavior. Despite its name, the Apollo Shark is not a true shark but is a member of the Cyprinidae family.





<p><b>Albino Pacu</b></p>		<p>Albino Pacu is a rare color variant of the Red-Bellied Pacu (<i>Piaractus brachypomus</i>), a freshwater fish related to piranhas. Unlike their wild counterparts, which have a dark, silver-gray body with a reddish belly, albino pacus have a pale, yellowish-white or pinkish body with red eyes due to the lack of pigmentation.</p>
